# Is Bleeding Between Periods Normal?

Endosee® Advance Direct Visualization System is used to view the cervix, uterus, or female urinary tract. The Endosee system uses a thin viewing camera inserted through the vagina. Tell your doctor if you have a vaginal, cervical or bladder infection, uterine bleeding, or heavy bleeding, known pregnancy, cervical cancer or recent uterine injury, or intolerance to anesthesia. A visual examination of the lining of the bladder and urinary tract is not used in patients with severe bleeding disorders, or with frequent urinary tract infections. ## **Does Endosee® Advance require an operating room?**

Endosee Advance can be used effectively in your doctor's office during a routine exam. Women may avoid the operating room or having to go under anesthesia.<sup>3</sup>

## **What happens afterwards?**

Endosee Advance provides your healthcare provider with instant, same day results. Your doctor can confidently plan the proper course of care right after your exam.

## **Should I be concerned about possible side effects?**

Some women do experience spotting, menstrual-like cramps and stomach discomfort. However, patients may have little or no discomfort during or after the procedure.<sup>3</sup>
